


## WLO presents the 2022 Progress Update from Signatories of the Glasgow Declaration

On the 30 January, as part of our responsibility as Supporting Organization signatory of the Glasgow Declaration on Climate Action in Tourism, World Leisure Organization (WLO) submitted its contribution for the 2022 Progress Update from Signatories. Throughout the last year, WLO has been working internally to align its operations to the commitments acquired by adhering to this declaration and will deliver its first Climate Action Plan in the following months.

WLO became a signatory party in January 2022 after its official launch at the UN Climate Changes Conference (COP26) in November 2021. The Glasgow Declaration on Climate Action in Tourism unites travel and tourism behind a common set of pathways for climate action, aligning the sector with global commitments and catalyzing collaborative solutions to the many challenges facing businesses and destinations globally. Nowadays the number of signatories to the Glasgow Declaration passes the 500-mark and includes all types of stakeholders which reflects its cross-sectorial commitment.

The Glasgow Declaration encourages the acceleration of climate action in tourism by securing commitments to reduce emissions in tourism by at least 50% over the next decade and achieve Net Zero as soon as possible before 2050.

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# WLO UN Virtual Side Event takes place on the 9 February in the framework of the United Nations CSocD61

In the framework of the 61st Session of the United Nations Commission for Social Development (CSocD61), on the 9 February WLO organized a Virtual Side Event endorsed by the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs on "Just and Favorable Conditions for Work: The Leisure Dimension".

The virtual side event was connected to the main theme of the session, "Creating full and productive employment and decent work for all as a way of overcoming inequalities to accelerate the recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic and the full implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development", which took place from the 6 to the 15 February at the UN Headquarters in New York.

On this occasion, the WLO UN Virtual Side Event counted on the participation of the co-chairs of WL SIG Leisure and Human Rights and the 2020 Charter for Leisure revision co-convenors, Prof. Atara Sivan and Prof. Tony (A.J.) Veal, who along the session could directly interact with participants from different corners of the globe.

At this session they delved deeper in the UN International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights and more specifically in the human rights declared for just and favorable conditions of work, and rest, leisure and reasonable limitation of working hours. Also, they linked this approach to the

2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the WLO Charter for Leisure, and on how you could get involved in the recent Research Project "Leisure Rights: Holding Governments to Account on Leisure Rights".

WLO participates as an observer at the Sixteenth Session of the UNESCO Intergovernmental Committee for the Protection and Promotion of the Diversity of Cultural Expressions

WLO COO Dr. Cristina Ortega Nuere attended the Sixteenth Session of the Intergovernmental Committee for the Protection and Promotion of the Diversity of Cultural Expressions held from the 7 to 10 February at UNESCO Headquarters in Paris. WLO has been appointed as an observer Nongovernmental Organization to the sessions of this Intergovernmental Committee after the approval of its written request. This recognition allows the organization to participate in the corresponding meetings between the civil society representatives and the Bureau and to provide written proposals in the preparation of these intergovernmental committee's sessions.

In keeping with its desire to broaden and diversify the range of stakeholders involved in promoting the objectives of the UNESCO 2005 Convention, the Committee discussed various modalities to strengthen collaboration with civil society organizations for its effective implementation. It also examined proposals to facilitate consultations with micro, small and medium-sized cultural and creative enterprises. It also considered proposals to highlight the commitment of cultural institutions and organizations to promote access to diverse cultural expressions originating in their territory or other countries of the world, as well as proposals to streamline the quadrennial periodic reporting cycle.

Furthermore, the Committee approved the funding requests submitted under the thirteenth call for funding

requests to the International Fund for Cultural Diversity and reaffirmed the fundamental role of this Fund for the implementation of the 2005 Convention. Finally, this session was an opportunity for the Committee to examine its report on its activities and decisions in order to transmit it to the 9th session of the Conference of Parties that will be held from the 6 to 8 June 2023.

### WLO attends the 2023 ECOSOC **Partnership Forum**

As an NGO with consultative status with ECOSOC, WLO attended the 2023 ECOSOC Partnership Forum which took place on the 31 January devoted to the theme "Accelerating the recovery from the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) and the full implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development at all levels".

Under the main theme of the 2023 ECOSOC and the High-level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF), the 2023 ECOSOC Partnership Forum brought together UN Member States and stakeholders from civil society, the private sector, scientists, women, youth, local governments, and many others, to discuss innovative efforts that are driving action on the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and to highlight the contributions that partnerships can make in this regard.

WLO also attended the informal Partnership Exchange organized by the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs which took place the day prior to the Forum, which provided a space for Member States and other stakeholders to share knowledge and expertise in the design and implementation of partnerships that will contribute to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

## Encounter with Dr. Ricardo Uvinha, Dean at the EACH University of Sao Paulo, Brazil, and Chair of the WLCE USP (Audio in Portuguese)
