6th World Leisure Expo & Forum took place on June 6-7 in Hangzhou, China

On June 6-7, the 6th edition of the World Leisure Expo and Forum took place in the city of Hangzhou, Zhejiang Province, China, organized every two years in partnership with Hangzhou Municipal Government. This biennial event is a major exhibition showcasing some of the most innovative businesses in the leisure sector at different levels. This edition was celebrated in parallel to the 15th China (Hangzhou) Urban Exhibition Development Conference.

On this occasion and after three years with a lack of WLO high-level face-to-face events in China, a delegation formed by WLO Chair, Prof. Joanne Schroeder; WLO COO, Dr. Cristina Ortega; WLO Board members, Dr. Jane Zhou, Prof. Dr. Ling Ping and Dr. Lucetta Tsai, attended this event which gathered Chinese and international high-level speakers, including authorities, practitioners and academics.

WLO Chair, Prof. Joanne Schroeder, Deputy Director of the Economic Committee of the 13th CPCC National Committee and Former Vice Minister of Commerce, Mr. Fang Aiqing, and Mayor of Hangzhou, Mr. Yao Gaoyuan opened the Expo and delivered welcome speeches to the international audience gathered at Hangzhou International Expo Center.

This event was also taken as an opportunity to acknowledge almost twenty years of close relationship and collaboration between WLO and Hangzhou Municipal Government. The city received a very special, significant and unique recognition by WLO as the World Leisure Innovation City for many reasons.

First, Hangzhou was acknowledged as one of the largest and leading digital cities in the world since this was recognized as the "Oriental Leisure City" in 2006, when the World Leisure Congress and the first World Leisure Expo were celebrated there. Since then, Hangzhou has been the first and unique city to hold this highlight event every two years and has become one of the world's most renowned international convention, conference, and exhibition centers at the forefront of the highest level of innovation.

In fact, the venue of the World Leisure Expo & Forum, Hangzhou International Expo Center, is one of the most pioneering exhibition centers in the world and has unveiled a new era of the sixth generation of exhibition venue in China from hardware facilities to software service and from operation pattern to profit pattern. It is located closed to the city's West Lake, a UNESCO World Heritage site immediately west of the city, which is among its best-known attractions. Additionally, in September 2015, Hangzhou was awarded with the Asian Games 2022, which will be celebrated in September 2023.

In the framework of the World Leisure Expo & Forum, the WL Executive Committee has the opportunity to hold a meeting at the beautiful location of West Lake International Expo Museum. They also visited some closed municipalities within the outstanding Zhejiang Province, such as Suichang, Keqiao and Sangyu.

WLO participates in UNESCO Global Sports Conference MINEPS VII (June 26-29, 2023)

From June 26-29, 2023, the UNESCO Global Sports Conference MINEPS VII has taken place in Baku, Azerbaijan, for its 7th edition and the first after the pandemic. WLO has been among the few organizations invited by UNESCO Sports to participate as an observer within this conference which has brought together Ministries of Sports from all over the globe, highlevel public authorities, development banks, athletes, and businesses to review progress and identify areas for action, especially in terms of data, training, and financing, in developing countries in particular. This was an opportunity for WLO to further connect and present its programs and initiatives to high-level national and supranational authorities, institutions and leaders in the leisure and sports fields at global level, for the benefit of our members and the advancement of the leisure field. The conference culminated with the launch of the Fit for Life Alliance.



2023 Suichang International Leisure Conference took place on June 8-9 at the WLCE-ZJU Innovation Base in Suichang, China

WLCE at Zhejiang University organized on June 8-9 the 2023 Suichang International Leisure Conference at its Innovation Base center located in Suichang, China. The theme of the conference was "Smart Leisure, Bright Future" and it marked a significant milestone in Suichang County's journey towards becoming a renowned international hub for leisure and innovation.

Suichang has set an ambitious goal of becoming a leading destination for outdoor sports and leisure activities in the Yangtze River Delta region. To achieve this goal, Suichang needs to unlock its full potential and achieve breakthroughs in leisure-driven development. Thus, this Conference provided an excellent platform for experts, scholars, and industry representatives in the fields of sports, culture, and tourism from both domestic and international backgrounds to engage in academic exchanges and industry discussions.

The city of Suichang also actively participated at the World Leisure Day. For instance, the Banchun Quan'nong Ceremony has joined this celebration for two consecutive editions. Also, it has been officially announced as the Innovation Base of the WLCE at Zhejiang University. Since 2018, this university has been an outstanding partner and contributor. Yoga can help cancer recovery

Cancer patients who practise YOCAS yoga can benefit from reduced levels of inflammation – helping their road to recovery and even preventing cancer from returning. The finding comes from research led by the University of Rochester Medical Centre in the US, published at the recent annual meeting of the American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO). Eligible participants were cancer survivors with insomnia. For the study, more than 500 people – with an average age of 56 – took part in a randomised control trial. All participants had received cancer treatment between two months and five years earlier.

Update from the WLO Special Interest Group on Leisure and Aging

The WLO Special Interest Group (SIG) on Leisure and Aging has well over 100 members involved in teaching research and practice on the subject. A bi-annual newsletter identifies research and communication opportunities as well as recent relevant publications; and an annual bibliography is organized to address the following subjects: coping with disability and illness in later life; games and other nonphysical leisure activities in later life; the influence of gender and other diversifying factors on leisure experience in later life; grandparenting and intergenerational leisure; leisure, aging and mental health; retirement and leisure; adventure, sports and physical activity in later life; technology, digital communications and media influences; travel and tourism in later life; volunteerism in later life. The upcoming World Leisure Congress in Dunedin, New Zealand will feature a session on some

of those themes, and a webinar is being organized in cooperation with WLO's Leisure Management Special Interest Group. UNESCO launches the project Fit for Life Alliance

The UNESCO Global Sports Conference MINEPS VII (Baku, Azerbaijan, June 26-29, 2023) - in which the WLO was represented by its Chief Operating Officer Dr. Cristina Ortega - culminated with the launch of the project Fit for Life Alliance. Powered by a global compact of partners, Fit for Life uses data driven sport interventions to tackle intersecting crises in physical inactivity, mental health, and inequality. Indeed, it was deeply emphasized the lack of standard research methodologies and data to analyze the impact of physical activity in different aspects of our society, such as those mentioned before.

WLYA International Leisure Leadership Training Camp is organized in Hungary

Organised by the World Leisure Youth Ambassadors (WLYA) program – under the coordination of Dr. Miklós Bánhidi, professor, chair of WLYA, Dr. Lee Kwan Meng, WLYA supervisor Malaysia, Dr. Beata Dobay, asc. professor, WLYA supervisor Selye University SK, and Dr. Paul Dragos, asc. Prof. University of Oradea, Romania - the International Leisure Leadership Training (ILLT) is a series of training events to train and develop talented young people who could undertake projects of programs to plan and organize a series of leisure and recreational activities (outdoor, adventure, and/ or environmental, tourism, arts and culture based) while developing organizing and leadership skills. The purpose of this project is to educate future leaders to be able to plan and lead leisure products and services. During the training program participants will be equipped with the capacity, knowledge and skills to be a future professional in the leisure industry. The project was developed in three consecutive phases: it started with a webinar series; then participants were required to prepare a leisure project in their home environment, using their leadership skills, and finally the results were shared in a physical training camp, which was organized at the end of May in Hungary.

Global events, such as the Olympic and Paralympic Games, world expositions, sporting championships, arts festivals and trade fairs, can be a catalyst for development at both local and national levels. Global events encourage external investment, boost tourism, grow trade, raise the profile of places and bring communities together. They can be used to galvanise commitment to policy priorities and accelerate investment. Fully leveraging the benefits of global events, however, requires significant upfront and long-term planning as well as well-designed monitoring and evaluation frameworks. The OECD launched on 6 July two new guides on: 1) How to measure the impact

of culture, sports and business events, and 2) Impact indicators for culture, sports and business events.

The study also identifies trends and provides a set of recommendations to advance the measurement of mountain tourism, including the enhancement of official tourism statistics through the use of big data and new technologies.
