As the strength training trend gathers pace, researchers highlight the benefits of keeping up the cardio

While strength training gives valuable muscular gains it doesn't give the heart health benefits of aerobic exercise, according to new research from Iowa State University. The newly-released research - Aerobic, resistance, or combined exercise training and cardiovascular risk profile in overweight or obese adults which was published in the European Heart Journal, found that either full cardio or half-strength, half-cardio are the most effective exercise programmes to protect the heart.

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Global Wellness Summit predicts 2024's top 10 wellness trends

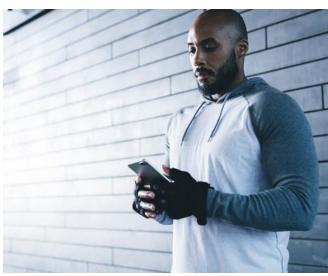

The Global Wellness Summit (GWS) has released its annual Future of Wellness report, forecasting what will make waves in the diverse world of wellness in the year ahead. Predictions in the 120-page report range from climate-adaptive wellness – offering new ways for us to cool our communities and homes as climate change takes hold – to the transformative effects of tech-supported art in the wellness space.

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Tech: Digital Futures: progress report

Consumer expectations are rising all the time, but nowhere more than in relation to digital. UK Active's Dave Gerrish explains how the industry is shaping up. Organisations across the UK health and fitness and leisure sectors are at different levels of maturity when it comes to digital transformation and although they're making strides, improvements can still be made to enable them to reach a wider audience and reduce inequalities by enabling better access.

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The Observatoire québécois du loisir identifies success factors in equipment lending

The Observatoire québécois du loisir, a research team based in the World Leisure Center of Excellence (WLCE) at the Université du Québec à Trois-Rivières in Canada, is investigating the implementation of equipment lending centers. This initiative has focused on identifying key success factors based on interviews with key stakeholders involved in European equipment lending initiatives. The goal of this publication is to facilitate and provide guidance for the implementation of regional banks and mobile recreational and sports equipment units, which Quebec is currently considering. Several success factors have been identified through these interviews. These include the importance of

offering a simple, flexible, easily accessible, and free service, as well as the significance of having nearby outdoor locations and infrastructures that are freely accessible. Additionally, cooperation and networking have been recognized as fundamental to the success of such initiatives. However, the interviews have also brought attention to various issues and challenges associated with setting up equipment lending centers. Questions have been raised regarding the potential conflict between state-funded initiatives and private enterprises, the long-term viability of an equipment lending model based on trust, and the effectiveness of these centers in promoting accessibility. Furthermore, concerns have been raised about managing the availability, storage, training, and transportation of the equipment involved in these initiatives.

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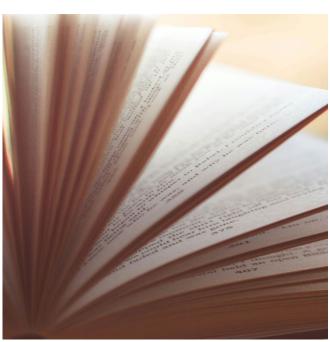

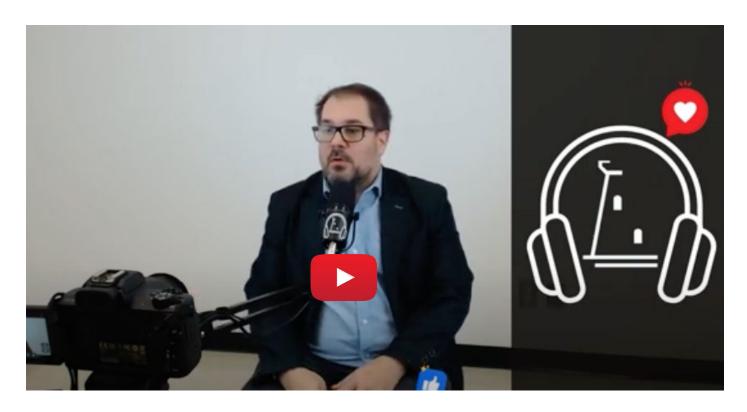
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Empowering Communities: The Vital Role of Leisure Professionals (in French, automatic subtitles available on YouTube)
