New GWI study unveils global wellness market leaders: US, China and Germany

The US, China, Germany, Japan and the UK have been identified as the world's five largest wellness markets in new research released today by the Global Wellness Institute (GWI). Called *The Global Wellness Economy: Country Rankings*, the new study provides market size, rankings, analysis and per capita wellness spending for 145 nations. Findings show the US remains the undisputed goliath in wellness spending, with an annual market worth US\$1.8 trillion, and ranking first in nine of the 11 wellness sectors measured by the GWI.





ACSM publishes its 2024 Worldwide Survey of Fitness Trends

The fitness industry is gearing up to engage with the medical profession according to the results of the American College of Sport's Medicine (ACSM) trends list for 2024. Now in its 18th year, the annual Worldwide Survey of Fitness Trends gathers data from thousands of respondents to predict the trends which will impact the fitness industry. While trends vary across the globe, exercise for improved health outcomes is prevalent everywhere, including exercise for weight loss in response to the obesity epidemic, exercise for older adults and exercise as medicine.

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UNWTO introduces its new name and brand: UN Tourism

On January 23, 2024, the World Tourism Organization (UNWTO) announced that hereafter will be officially renamed as UN Tourism. This big announcement took place during Fitur 2024, the annual Madrid International Tourism Fair. During Fitur 2024, UN Tourism also presented its priorities for the sector for the year ahead and the results of the first World Tourism Barometer of the year highlighting the sector's recovery, with international arrivals back to 88% of prepandemic levels at the end of 2023.

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Glasgow Declaration signatory parties presents the Implementation Report 2023 in the framework of **Fitur 2024**

On January 25, 2024, in the framework of the Madrid International Tourism Fair, Fitur 2024, the signatory parties of the Glasgow Declaration on Climate Action in Tourism held an insightful event to present the results of the Glasgow Declaration Implementation Report 2023 and provide a platform to brainstorm on next steps. In fact, this was intended to be a dynamic discussion with four predefined and clear objectives: to showcase achievements and success stories in climate action, to encourage collaborative efforts among industry leaders and destinations, to identify obstacles and explore solutions to accelerate climate action in tourism and to promote awareness on the importance and benefits of climate action in tourism. With this flagship event, the Glasgow Declaration has proven to be a fundamental catalyst for increased urgency about the need to accelerate climate action in tourism and to secure strong commitments to support the global goals to halve emissions over the next decade. Until December 2023, over 850 organizations have signed this declaration.



Call for papers Leisure Studies Association Conference 2024 (extended deadline!)

The Leisure Studies Association (LSA) will hold its 2024 Conference from July 10 to 12, 2024 at University of the West of Scotland, UK, with the theme "(Re)claiming Leisure: Rights, Responsibilities, and Resistance". The LSA 2024 Conference seeks to bring together inter and multidisciplinary perspectives on leisure, events, tourism and sport and, to explore their relationship to global challenges. Specifically, it aims to initiate discussion on the importance of Rights, Responsibilities, and Resistance as they play out in the transformation of society. The Scientific Committee now invites researchers, educators, and practitioners, amongst others, to submit abstracts for papers, posters, workshops, panels and productions such as performances, short-films, and other artistic expressions, by no later than March 1, 2024, Friday.

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Call for abstracts for ATLAS Africa ONLINE Conference 2024 – Tourism after freedom: Democratic Africa

South Africa celebrates three decades of democracy and freedom in April 2024. Not unlike most other countries on the African continent, this watershed moment for the respective nations introduced new dispensations in a postcolonial environment. Tourism was – both before and after these changes - an integral component of the respective African country's economies and infrastructures. Since the mid twentieth century when these historical changes began taking place, tourism has been perpetuated as an integral feature of societies of various African destinations. This ATLAS Africa online conference, to be held on 26 April 2024, calls for papers that reflect on the "then and now", as well as how travel and tourism as an industry and profession has changed, revived and reinvented itself over the past half century or so across the African continent. Abstracts submission closes on February 15, 2024! The conference will take place in Zoom and will be free of charge.

The Forum québécois du loisir - whose 2024 edition will take place in Trois-Rivières on the 11 and 12 March 2024 - is a collective achievement that highlights current leisure issues and brings together hundreds of players at the heart of the leisure world. It is a remarkable forum for concerted action and mobilization, designed to affirm the importance of leisure in Quebec society and promote leisure and its accessibility to the population's quality of life. Since its first edition in 1999, the Forum québécois du loisir has been a must-attend event for all those involved and interested in leisure. The event, held in French, is coordinated by the Conseil québécois du loisir, leader of the World Leisure Chapter in the region. The 8th edition of the Forum québécois du loisir is supported by the Government of Quebec.

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ATINER announces its 9th Annual International Symposium on Leisure & Research

"Living Green, Liveable Cities" Research Symposium to take place in Doha

The International Association of Horticultural Producers (AIPH) will host next February 4 and 5, 2024, the Research Symposium "Living Green, Liveable Cities", in Doha, Qatar. This will take place alongside the Expo 2023 Doha Qatar which will conclude in March 2024. Presentations will touch upon designing therapeutic environments, nature-based urban design, and the impact of green spaces on overall wellbeing. Environmental health topics will include the effects of green solutions on city health and local-scale assessments for air quality. The symposium will conclude with insights into the role of sensory gardens and integrating nature into urban life for enhanced health and wellbeing. The Research Symposium accompanies the special Cities & Health journal issue, also titled 'Living Green, Liveable Cities'. This special issue was instigated by AIPH and Expo 2023 Doha Qatar to investigate the science and practice supporting the concept showcased the Expo of creating liveable and healthy urban environments through city greening.
