WLO leaders attend the third Global Digital Trade Expo in Hangzhou, China

WLO Chairwoman Joanne Schroeder, Board Member Jane Zhou, and Chief Operating Officer (COO) Cristina Ortega recently represented WLO at the third Global Digital Trade Expo, held at the Hangzhou Grand Convention and Exhibition Center in Xiaoshan district, for a full week starting on September 25. This event, a significant gathering of global leaders in the leisure and tourism sectors, showcased innovative trends and digital advancements in the industry. The Expo was preceded by an exclusive dinner attended by prominent dignitaries, including the Mayor of Hangzhou and several ambassadors. WLO advances partnership with South Africa through a series of events

In late September and early October, the World Leisure Organization (WLO) took another significant step in strengthening its longstanding collaboration with the City of Cape Town Metropolitan Government (CoCT) and the University of the Western Cape (UWC). This visit showcased a variety of key events that fostered knowledge exchange and collaboration between WLO, South African institutions, and international stakeholders.

The first of these events was the Leisure Experience Research Opportunity (LERO), held from September 25 to October 1. Co-led onsite by Prof. Dr. Marie Young and Dr. Makhaya Malema, alongside WLO Board member Dr. Miklos Banhidi, this unique field research project focused on assessing recreation programs in Cape Town, with an international orientation aimed at promoting active and healthy communities in the city.

On October 2, UWC hosted the World Leisure Young Ambassadors Student Conference. This event featured insightful presentations from students representing South Africa, other African nations, and beyond, offering them the opportunity to showcase their work to an



international audience. WLO would like to extend particular thanks to Dr. Miklos Banhidi for his outstanding work in organizing this conference and for his ongoing commitment to nurturing the next generation of leisure researchers and professionals.

October 3 marked the official opening of the Leisure and Tourism Conference 2024 (LTC2024), where WLO Chairwoman Joanne Schroeder delivered a keynote speech on leisure social prescription. Additionally, WLO Chief Operating Officer Dr. Cristina Ortega presented the organization and its key programs to the gathered international participants. Several WLO Board members also contributed to the event with scientific presentations: Dr. Marcel Bastiaansen, Dr. Lucetta Tsai, Dr. Gıyasettin Demirhan, and Dr. John Dattilo, providing diverse and highly relevant insights.

The WLO visit concluded with a pivotal inperson meeting of the WLO Board of Directors. This gathering initiated discussions on the organization's next Strategic Plan and featured the presentation of new university candidacies for joining the World Leisure Centers of Excellence network.

Another highlight of the visit was the invitation extended by Dr. Lyndon Bouah, Chief Director for Sport and Recreation in the Western Cape



Department of Cultural Affairs and Sport, to Joanne Schroeder, Cristina Ortega, and Board member Marie Young. They participated in a panel discussion organized by the government of Cape Town, which brought together public servants from various departments, including tourism, recreation, and sports. The event provided a platform to explore potential alignments between WLO and Cape Town's strategic plans and was followed by a productive working meeting that opened new collaboration opportunities with promising prospects for the future.



EXPORECREACIÓN 2024: "Recreation and Life: Building Territories of Well-being"

In its fifth edition, this academic-experiential event was held on September 18-20 by the College of Health Sciences, at the Universidad Tecnológica Pereira (Colombia), within its Sports Sciences and Recreation program. This university is in the city of Pereira, the largest and most developed of the cities in the coffee axis, the seventh largest in the country, with approximately 500 thousand inhabitants. The theme of this edition was "Recreation and Life: Building Territories of Well-being", addressing three academic lines: 1. Educational practices and territories of well-being mediated by recreation and leisure; 2. Territories of well-being: integral health, diversity and inclusion, sustainable development based on recreation and leisure, and 3. Territory of well-being in the areas of political management, governance, and social commitment from recreation. This event was attended by more than 400 participants from six Latin American countries, with a program that included national and international conferences, 26 workshops, presentation of 30 technicalscientific papers, as well as an international forum that discussed the theme "Future of Recreation in Latin America". This program also

included local artistic presentations and, at the end, a beautiful performance by the Colombian Institute of Classical Ballet. In this session, five researchers received a special award for their contributions in this field of knowledge. It is important to note that Colombia developed its first National Recreation Plan in the 1990s, which has been regularly reviewed. At this event, the progress of the current plan (2020-2026) focused on healthy lifestyles and recreation.


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New Special Issue of the *World Leisure Journal* explores "Unstructured Entanglements of Human Leisure and Nonhuman Animal Life"


