### **Digital Futures 2024 report** shows growth opportunities as focus turns to data and AI across fitness and leisure market

On 28 November, UK active and Sport England released the Digital Futures 2024 report, marking a successful fourth year of consultation. The report provides a measure of how the UK physical activity sector, including fitness and leisure operators, National Governing Bodies for Sport, Active Partnerships, sports clubs and other providers are embracing digital and the next steps required for growth. This year saw 117 eligible UK fitness, leisure and sport organisations complete the consultation, representing 1,600 sites and around four million members nationwide. Since the Digital Futures programme began in

2021, 295 organisations have completed the consultation. The report tracks trends in the sector's digital adoption and this year's consultation shows an increase in the number of organisations using the latest artificial intelligence (AI) in day-to-day operations (up 3% from 2023), with more saying they plan to use AI in the future.


#### Webinar recording available! The Future of Higher **Education in Leisure and Recreation**



## The latest issue of *World Leisure Journal* is out now!

Volume 66, Issue 4, is the latest Special Issue of World Leisure Journal on "Unstructured" entanglements of human leisure and nonhuman animal life". This Issue explores the complex, intertwined relationships between humans and nonhuman animals within the realm of leisure. As human society increasingly recognizes the sentience and agency of nonhuman species, leisure studies are undergoing an "animal turn" moving beyond anthropocentric perspectives to view leisure as a multispecies experience. This issue highlights the rich, diverse "entanglements" humans share with animals across a spectrum of settings, from structured interactions like pet ownership and wildlife tourism to spontaneous encounters in parks, cityscapes, and wilderness areas. Featuring eight articles, this issue covers a range of animals—including dogs, birds, and wild animals like bears—and examines how human leisure activities impact, and are influenced by, these creatures. The collection challenges conventional species categories and encourages new ways of understanding animals as individuals with unique needs and behaviors. By rethinking the ethics and scope of leisure studies, this special issue provides a fresh perspective on human-animal interactions and invites researchers to embrace multispecies approaches that respect the agency of all beings involved.


